THE IMPORTANCE OF PRAYER

Thank you for joining together in prayer. Prayer is a response to God and what he's revealed about himself in his Word. You may like to meditate on the following Scripture as you go to the Lord in prayer, trusting that he hears and responds to the prayers of his sons and daughters who pray to him in the name of Jesus.

Unless the LORD builds the house, those who build it labor in vain. Unless the LORD guards the city, the guard keeps watch in vain. It is in vain that you rise up early and go late to rest, eating the bread of anxious toil; for he gives sleep to his beloved. (Psalm 127:1-2)

And Jesus told them a parable to the effect that they ought always to pray and not lose heart.... And the Lord said, "Hear what the unrighteous judge says. And will not God give justice to his elect, who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long over them? I tell you, he will give justice to them speedily. Nevertheless, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"
(Luke 18:1, 6-8)

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. (Philippians 4:4-6)

As you work your way through some of these prayer points, keep in mind the mission of our church. According to the Great Commission (Matthew 28:18-20), we are called as a church to make disciples of Jesus who make disciples of Jesus for the glory of God. Make that mission the focal point of your prayers.

As you begin, it's good to have God's Word in front of you as you pray. You might also like to begin by acknowledging to God just how gracious and merciful he has been to us, that he has not given us what our sins deserve. And thus even in the midst of hardship, we have much for which to give thanks. May the Lord bless us and bear much fruit through our prayers (James 5:16).

PRAISE AND THANKSGIVING TO GOD

A Prayer of Thanksgiving – from the Book of Common Prayer:

Almighty God, Father of all mercies, we your unworthy servants give you humble and hearty thanks for all your goodness and loving kindness to us and to all people; We bless you for our creation, preservation, and all the blessings of this life; But above all for your amazing love in the redemption of the world by our Lord Jesus Christ; for the

means of grace, and for the hope of glory. And we pray, give us that due sense of all your mercies, that our hearts may be truly thankful and that we may declare your praise not only with our lips, but in our lives, by giving ourselves to your service, and by walking before you in holiness and righteousness all our days; through Jesus Christ our Lord, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, be all honor and glory, now and for ever. Amen.

- Praise and thank God for:
 - The good news of Jesus that we have been delivered from the consequences of our sin through Jesus' perfect life, his sacrificial death in our place, and his victorious resurrection from the dead. That this is a gift we cannot and have not earned or deserved.
 - The relationship we now have with God through repentance and faith in Christ – that we're forgiven, regenerated, and adopted as his sons and daughters.
 - A healthy and vibrant church that loves Jesus, loves each other, and is committed to God's Word.
 - God's continued faithfulness and provision to us over the years at Christ Church.

THE 2025-2026 PRAYER FOCUS FOR CCNYC

The prayer focus for this upcoming year that the elders have set for the church is to pray for an increasing *culture of encouragement* at CCNYC. Would you please join us in praying that we would grow as a community that seeks to build each other up in Christ through a ministry of Word-driven, Spirit-empowered encouragement?

1 Thessalonians 5:11, *Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing.*

Focus: Pray for the needs of the world around you: family members, neighbors, medical workers, government officials, those who are suffering financially, and those who are sick. Ask the Lord to sustain, provide, heal, and guide. Ask him to give his people endurance, wisdom, and hope.

MISSIONS AND EVANGELISM

Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. (Matthew 28:19-20)

But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people for his own possession, that you may proclaim the excellencies of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light. (1 Peter 2:9)

Focus: Consider those in your life who do not know the Lord. Pray that they would seek the Lord. Ask the Lord to open their eyes, ears, minds, and hearts to the truth of his Word. Pray that they would turn to the Lord and find salvation, refuge, and help. Pray for the evangelistic work of missions and missionaries throughout the world.

- **Mission Mindset** pray that we would all be increasingly shaped by the fact that we are a people on mission in this world, sent to verbally communicate the good news of Jesus and to live out its implications for the glory of God and the good of others.
- **Personal and Church Evangelism** pray for the evangelistic efforts of those in our church; pray for the Word 1-1 outreach efforts using John's Gospel; pray for evangelism courses like Christianity Explored to be used effectively by our church.
- **Bounce Around** thanksgiving for the renewal of this ministry to the community this summer. Pray for continued spiritual fruit for the contacts that have been made and for wisdom for the future of this ministry beyond the summer.
- **Church Planting** pray that the Lord would give us a clear vision for how we can be about the work of multiplying churches in the world.
- **Church Renewal** pray that the Lord would give us a clear vision for how we can encourage the renewal of dying churches through prayer, support, and the equipping and sending of leaders.
- **Leadership Development** pray that our church would be a place of theological and ministerial training, equipping gospel workers to go into this city and throughout the world.
- **Conversion and Worldwide Revival** that God would be pleased to use CCNYC to partner in that work, and that his Spirit would draw many people in from the wider community. Pray for an increasing strategy, intentionality, and vision for how we participate with God in this work.

Pray for a spiritually fruitful and God-honoring ministry among us.

- **Music Ministry** that the Lord would help us to all sing with joy and in truth when we meet together as a church

- **Children's Ministry** for the hearts of our children to be transformed by Jesus + gospel opportunities to children and families in the wider community + more families to make CCNYC their home.
- **Youth Ministry** for fellowship and encouragement among the youth of our church, as well as for their outreach efforts, especially for the Youth Nights this fall.
- **Men's and Women's Groups** thanksgiving for the men's study group that grew this past year. Pray for continued solid discipleship for both men and women in the church.
- **Godliness, Unity, Love, Peace, and Humility** pray that these things would define us as a community sharing in life together.
- **Community Groups** for true fellowship and a commitment to the work of evangelism and discipleship among those who attend, as well as for leaders.
- **Deep, Christ-Centered Community** pray that our conversations would be filled with the Word of God as we seek to love and serve each other.
- Discipleship Relationships for the formation of relationships among members of the church that intentionally seek to do each other spiritual good.
- **Disciple-Making Disciples** pray that the Lord would form in each of us such maturity that we would fully give ourselves to the work of the Great Commission (Matt 28:18-20) by making disciples who make disciples for the glory of God.
